# Thomas Hubert Barclay

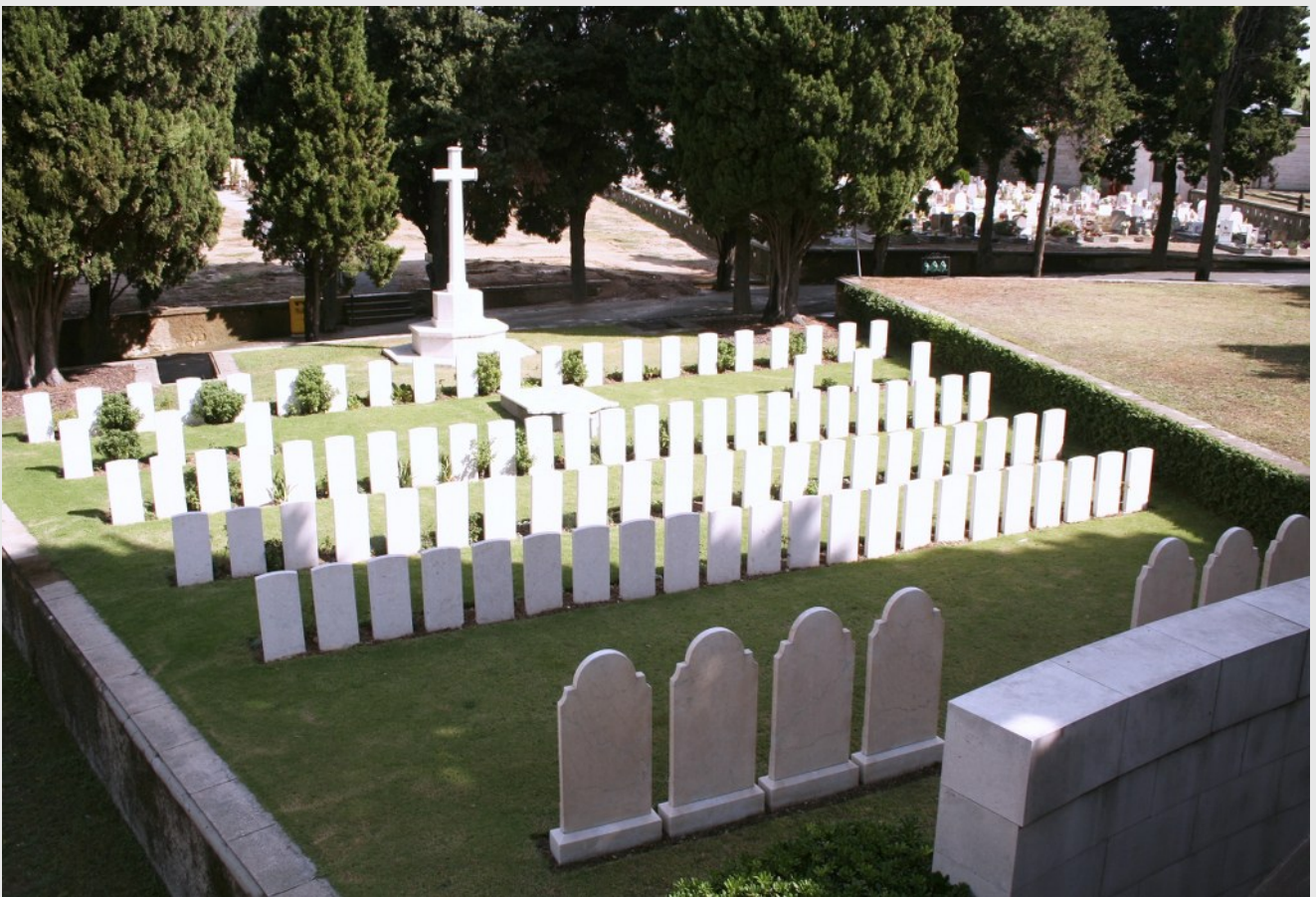
1st/1st, Surrey Yeomanry (Queen Mary's Regiment)
