



The left hand half of an early 17C. house, timber framed with rowl posts brick nogged with large external ironstone chimney, crowstepped on South, with cat-slide roof over added back outshot. End entrance beside chimney. Possibly the hearthroom end of a farm house with attic, perhaps divided into two in late 19C.

Timber framing in square panels, with 2 rivets tension braces. Original outshot, approached from under the stairs, was a lean-to - there is a blocked window on first floor now covered by cat-slide. Door in Creg-ny-Baa could have been entrance to service rooms or cross passage. Stairs probably moved. 4 centred arched door in partition, similar to one to outshot, now blocked. Spine beam and joists channeled with lamb's tongue stops. 18C. corner cupboard. First floor window may have had sliding shutter. Attic always floored. Wind braces. Rafters pegged to purlin. Comparatively recently converted into two houses.
