

Late 17c. Timber framed building of four bays, with two end chimneys.

Framing unusual - with extra rail above first floor level.

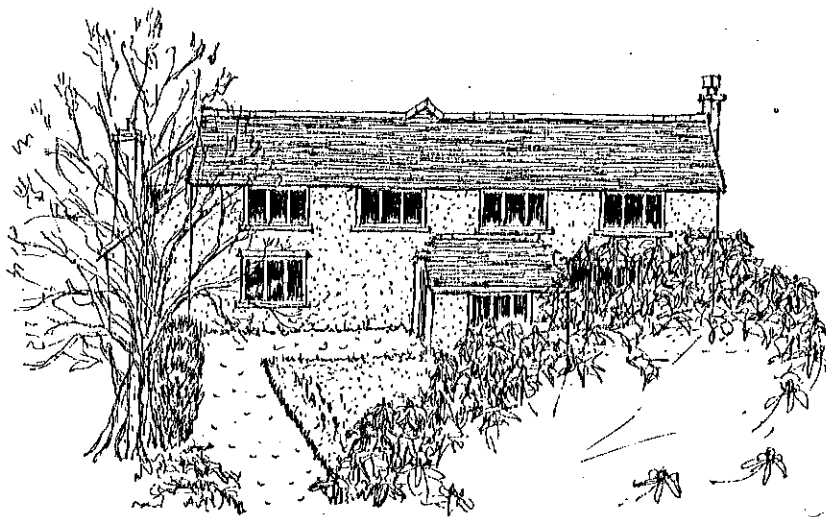
Framing in square panels with large corner tension braces.

Chisel cut Roman numerals as carpenters marks. Brick nogging.

ledged rafters. Curved raking over ports, also straight ones at end.
Clasped purlins.

Main roof gabled. Extension hipped. External walls now rendered.

It has been suggested, because of its plan, that the building was once two estate cottages, now one house, but there is no proof of this.
