ALBURY (or **ALDBURY**), 2 miles north-east from Chilworth station on the South Eastern railway, 5 east of Guildford and 36 from London, is a parish and village, in the Western division of the county, Blackheath hundred, second division, Guildford union, Guildford and Godalming county court district, rural deanery of Guildford, archdeaconry of Surrey, diocese of Winchester, situated in a vale at the foot of a range of chalk hills, which extend from near Farnham into Kent; here, on a plain, a short distance from the road to Cranley, is the foundation of what is generally considered to have been a Roman temple. The church of SS. Peter & Paul, in the village, is a Gothic brick building, having nave, aisles and transept, with tower, clock and 6 bells; it was erected at the expense of H. Drummond, esq. and has been restored by the Duke of Northumberland. The register dates from the year 1559. The living is a rectory, yearly value £655, with residence, in the gift of the Duke of Northumberland and held by the Rev. Robert James Dundas, M.A. of Exeter College, Oxford. There is a chapel

on a large scale, and an octagon chapter-house for the use of the Catholic Apostolic church. The charities amount to £28 yearly. There are many mansions and good residences. The Duke of Northumberland is lord of the manor and the principal landed proprietor, and has a seat here—Albury park: the mansion, which has been rebuilt, stands in a park of about 120 acres. The soil is of a light sandy nature; subsoil, gravel and chalk. The chief crops are wheat, barley and oats. The area is 3,470 acres; rateable value, £6,376; and the population in 1871 was 1,164.

FARLEY HEATH, to the south, is in this parish. *Parish Clerk*, James Potter.

ALFOLD (or **ALDFOLD**) is a parish and village, partly in Sussex in the Western division of the county, hundred of Blackheath, Guildford and Godalming county court district, Hambleton union, rural deanery of Godalming, archdeaconry of Surrey and diocese of Winchester, 4 miles west from the Baynards station, 9 south-east from Godalming, on the borders of Sussex, and 1 mile east from the Surrey and Sussex canal. The church of St. Nicholas is in the Early English style, having chancel, nave, north aisle, and north and south porches. The register dates from the year 1558. The living is a rectory, commuted yearly value £360, with residence, in the gift of Capt. Cecil Norton, and held by the Rev. William Norton, B.A., Trinity College, Dublin, M.A. by Bishop of Durham. The Earl of Onslow is lord of

the manor. The principal landowners are John King, esq. Captain John Lutman Johnson, and Jonas Oastler, esq. The soil is heavy; subsoil, clay. The chief crops are wheat, beans, barley, oats, turnips, and mangolds. The area is 2,883 acres, of which 279 are in Sussex; and the population in 1871 was 494, of which 24 are in Sussex.
