In the Name of God Amen: ⁵ ffirste Daye of Aprill, in ye yeare of our Lorde god one Thousand sixe hundreth & foure: I Thomas Farlye of Farlie green within the Parische of Allbery in ye County of Surrey yerman, being sicke and weake in bodye; but of p(er)fecte remembrance, good Memoyre & whoole in mynde, thankes bee given to god, Doo make & ordayne this my last will & Testamēt in manner and forme following: First I Bequeath my soule to Allmighty God my Creatour and Redeemer, hooping to be saved by the Deathe & passion of o(v)r Lorde & Savior Christe Jesus, And my Bodye to bee buyried in ye Churchyard of Allbery. Item I give unto Thomas Farlye my youngest sonne Tenne poundes when hee shall accomplishe ye full aidge of xxi^y yeares; And yf my said sonne Doo not so longe Lyve, Then I will y(het) my said legacy shall be equally Divided betwene my Daughters Jean and Alice, and to ye longer Lyver of them. Item I will & bequeath unto my said Daughters Jean and Alice Farlie, to ech of them Tenne poundes, to bee payde unto them by my sone and heire Francee Farlye, when they shall come to their aidge of xxi^y yeares, And yf my said Daughters Doo not so longe lyve, then ech of them to bee thothers heire. Item my will and pleasure is, y(het) if my said sone and heire doo refuse to paie my last to my said Daughters in manner and forme aforesaid, That then y^{mediately} after they shall accomplishe their ^{legacy bequeathed,} ~~sa~~ yeares, it shall & may bee Lawfull to & for them & only of them into any & p(er)cell of my Lande within the parische of Allbery afores'd, or elles where within ye County of Surrey at their & evry (of) their choyse, will and pleasure to Enter, have, houlde & Enjoye freely which bee worthe in value unto them & evry of them Tenne poundes. Item I will y^{shall yevely} my Brother George Farlye his heires & assignes shall have spare Land for ye whoole space of three yeares nexte to thothers Discease, yf hee & they or any of them shall survive her, to be to be houlde by him or her strippie or waste, y(het) hee or they paye unto my three sisters fyve poundes within one yeare after my said thothers Discease, and give unto my heires, Executors & assignes bond for ye Discharge and payement of ye said fyve poundes. Item I will & Bequeath unto Dorothy my wife all my Landes & Tenements within ye County of Surrey to bee houlde & Enjoyed by her withowt any strippie or waste untill my sone & heire shall come unto ye full aidge of xxi^y yeares: And if shee doo marrye Then I will she shall paye unto my said sone forty shillings yearlye duringe y^{my} said Terme. unto Nyeholas Elyot one sheepe, And Margaret Gylkyn my servante one sheepe ^{then I give} to bee Delyvered unto them within one Quarter of A yeare nexte after my Discease. Item I Give unto my two Goddaughters two Lombs, to bee Delyvered unto them when they are wayne-able. The Residue of all my goodes and Moveables inbequeathed I give unto Dorothy my wife, whose I make and Ordayne my sole Executrix of this my last will & Testamēt, all former revoked and adnullid. Supervisors of this my Will I make and Appointe Francee Dennyer, and Williem Challighen, To whom in Token of good will I give iij^s iij^d. Therise Bearinge witness whose hands & markes are here under subscribed.
