The last will and Testam^t of Thomas Street of Aldeburie in the Countie of Surrey
Taylor, as he declared it out of his owne mouth being mortally sick in bodie but of good
understanding as that present (?), upon the ~~15th~~^{15th} daye of Maye 1617 unto us whose names are
underwritten, viz to me Willm Dwtred Clarke parson of Aldeburie, and to us Geors Aldred
of Aldeburie yeoman and Thomas Whitmore the elder of Aldeburie also husbandmen, was in
forme following. First having made a Christian confession of his faith and commended his soule
into the hands of Almighty god and our saviour Jesus Christ, he ordained Jone his wife the
sole executrix of this his last will. Then he gave and bequeathed out of his goods and chattells
the summe of ffyfte shillings to be divided equally among his fyve daughters Elizabeth, Rose,
Rebecke Katherine and Francis, that is ten shillings apiece to be paid unto them at the age
of Twentie and one yeeres by his before named executrix. Then he gave unto the said
Jone his wife his horse and all his lands within the parish of Aldeburie untill his heire
shall come to the age of Twentie and one yeeres, for the maintaining and
bringing up of all his children, yf she should not longe continue a widowe; But yf she
should marry before his said heire should attain to that age of 21 yeeres, he willed,
that his said wife should only enjoye her third of the house & lands, and that the other two
parts should be employed for the maintenance & bringing up of all his children as before.
Then he gave and bequeathed the summe of Twelve pounds to those his said fyve daughters
and the child w^{ch} (?) his wife at the time of making this his will wear (?) wth (?) being yett unborn
to be divided equally among them, the said summe of Twelve pounds he appointed should
be payed by his said heire (being his only sonne) out of the house and lands before said,
within the space of fyve yeeres by fofte shillings a yeere to begin immediately after
his coming to the age of Twentie and one yeeres. And in witnesse that this was the
true and last will of the said Thomas Street sett downe as here as we could remember
in his owne words, and after the declaring of w^{ch} he survived not past three howers or
therabouts, w^{ch} also he had acknowledged both wth his hand and seale yf he had lived
till I the said Willm Dwtred could have had leysure to have sett downe the same in forme
(being then called awaye wth earnest business, and as then for the present not conceaving
his end to be so nere, w^{ch} was afterwards hastened by an externall accident) we
have here unto sett our hands the Seaventh daye of March 1617
